CHRIST OUR HOPE: BUILDING A VIBRANT CHURCH:

We are preparing to participate in this first ever diocesan-wide campaign; it is rooted in the works of Christ and the outcomes of the Synod to build vibrant parishes (preaching), strengthen our evangelization (teaching) and communicate the passion of Christ in our service to the most vulnerable (healing).

The campaign offers a financial opportunity for our parish (60% of the funds we raise comes back to us) as well as for the larger Catholic community. Together we will renew, strengthen and secure a future for the Catholic Church in VT. Next week Bishop Coyne will celebrate the official public kickoff. You can hear his thoughts and learn more about why this campaign is so important at the beginning of Sunday 10:00AM Mass, which will be live-streamed at www.vermontcatholic.org/tvmas.

MASS PROTOCOLS—PLEASE READ:

- † Daily Masses are being held in the chapel, with a maximum of (10) people (See Mass schedule above for times).
- † Weekend Masses have resumed with the same schedule as before — 4:30PM Saturday, and 8:30AM & 10:30AM on Sunday. Because of space constraints, we are allowed a maximum of 85 people in the church.

Please take a few moments to review all the protocols we have been given. Though we have been doing this for a while, it's good to refresh the memory with the guidelines. We ask that you approach Mass with charity and love for our clergy and all in our faith community by following them! Feel free to call the rectory at 893-2487 with any questions or concerns you may have.

- † **DO NOT COME** to Mass if you are not feeling well;
- † Masks are required upon entry and during Mass;
- † Sanitize your hands upon entry;
- † Sit in designated pews & respect social-distancing between others of 6 feet or more (at least 2 chairs) unless you are one family unit.
- † **Begin seating in the MIDDLE of the pew** and work your way outward to prevent others from getting closer than 6 feet to you;
- † Refrain from congregating in tight areas and do not go into areas that are cordoned off;
- † Follow directions with respect to receiving Communion;
- † The front entryway bathroom will be the **only one** open in the church, and will be available for emergencies only;
- † We are limited to a 25% capacity in the church, which is 85 people. If you wish to attend, you must sign up via the link on our parish website or by calling the rectory.
- † Each person attending needs a spot; if you are a family of 4, then please enter each person's name individually (we have been asked to keep a record of who has been here for contact tracing).
- † You will need to sign up EACH WEEK that you wish to attend Mass. New sign-ups for the upcoming weekend will begin on Mondays, and will continue through Friday, ending at Midnight (12:00AM).

CONFIRMATION RESCHEDULED: The Diocese has given us a new date for Confirmation! It will be held at 7:00PM on Thursday, October 8th, at St. Joseph's Cathedral in Burlington. We will be confirmed with students from Fairfax and Georgia. We are awaiting further details from the Diocese. Once we have that information we will communicate it to you. We do know that it will look different than it has in past years, but are so joyful for the opportunity to finally celebrate this Sacrament with your sons and daughters.

FIRST COMMUNION UPDATE: We received word from the Diocese that we are now able to start planning and preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion. Although a date has not yet been set for First Communion, I anticipate it will take place sometime in mid-to late October. This will give us time to start the new Religious Education year, participate in the Parent First Communion Meeting, as well as finish our preparation classes for First Communion. RCIA 2020-2021 WILL SOON BEGIN: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is the program for adults to receive initiation into the Catholic Church. It includes a preparation period, reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, followed by a period of instruction on how to live the faith. If you have not received one of these Sacraments or know an adult who may be interested in becoming Catholic, please contact Fr. Feltz, the Rectory, or Deacon Paul (contact info on the front of the bulletin). This year's session is set to begin on Saturday, Sept. 5th at 5:15pm (following 4:30PM Mass). RCIA is also a wonderful way for the fully initiated adults to continue to grow in their faith; many have participated over last several years. Please join us!
