### MASS SIGN-UP INFORMATION:

We may all be suffering a bit from "Covid Fatigue" as we head into the fall months, but it is more important than ever that we each do our part to stay safe and protect one another.

**\*\*PLEASE NOTE: WE ARE REQUIRING YOU TO SIGN UP IN ADVANCE TO ATTEND WEEKEND MASS HERE IN CHURCH.**

To register, you may either call the rectory at 893-2487, or go to the parish website at: [www.stannmilton.com](http://www.stannmilton.com) and use the link to the sign up page. \*\* Each person must INDIVIDUALLY sign up; do not sign up "Smith family", rather it should be "Jim Smith, Sue Smith, John Smith, Jane Smith."

Upon arrival at church, a greeter will check your name off of the attendance list. If you have come WITHOUT reserving a spot, you will have to wait before entering church to make sure our numbers are in compliance. If the 85 person limit is reached, you will not be able to stay for the Mass. We DO NOT wish to turn anyone away that wants to come and worship; we also do not wish to make any parishioner feel uncomfortable if there are too many people. Reminder that we can accommodate 85 people per Mass to maintain the social distance requirements.

**MASK REMINDERS:** Reminder that masks MUST BE WORN INTO CHURCH AND FOR THE ENTIRE DURATION of the Mass (excluding kids aged 2 and under). We have learned that if Bishop Coyne hears of a parish who doesn't comply with this rule, he may suspend public celebration of Mass. Thank you for your consideration of your fellow parishioners!

**THANKSGIVING:** This year's Thanksgiving celebrations will look very different than in years past due to the pandemic. Instead of gathering together in person to share a meal, perhaps we will have a meal at home, and FaceTime, Zoom, or call one another during the day. This holiday was celebrated first by the Pilgrims who wanted to give thanks for the blessings God had given them as they were seeking their individual freedom. Even though this year is very challenging in so many ways, it is important for us to see and be grateful for all the blessings we all have and to ask for God's blessings upon our community and families. Parishioners are invited to bring bread and wine to the Thanksgiving Day Mass to be blessed for their Thanksgiving Day meal. **\*\*NOTE: BREAD SHOULD BE WRAPPED IN PLASTIC OR PLACED IN A ZIP-LOC BAG.**
